

# SSC CHSL Details 2023

## About Exam

The Staff Selection Commission will hold a competitive examination for recruitment to the Group C posts viz. Lower Divisional Clerk/ Junior Secretariat Assistant, and Data Entry Operators for various Ministries/ Departments/ Offices of the Government of India and various Constitutional Bodies/ Statutory Bodies/ Tribunals, etc.

## Essential Educational Qualifications (As on 01-08-2023)

- For Data Entry Operator (DEO)/ DEO Grade 'A' in the Office of Comptroller and Auditor General of India (C&AG), Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, and Ministry of Culture: 12th Standard pass in science stream with Mathematics as a subject from a recognized Board or equivalent.
- For LDC/ JSA and DEO/ DEO Grade 'A' Candidates must have passed 12th Standard or equivalent examination from a recognized Board or University.
- The candidates who have appeared in their 12th Standard or equivalent examination can also apply, however they must possess Essential qualification on or before the cut-off date i.e., 01-08-2023.

## Scheme of Examination

The Computer Based Examination will be conducted in two tiers as indicated below

## Mode of Selection

Minimum qualifying marks in Tier-I, and Section-I, Section-II & Module-I of Section-III of Tier-II Examination are as follows:

- Candidates will be shortlisted for Tier-II Examination on the basis of their performance in Tier-I Examination. Normalized scores of candidates will be used to determine merit and for final selection.
- Tier-II Examination will be conducted for all the candidates qualified in Tier-I. In Tier-II, all the candidates will be required to appear in all three sections.
- In Tier-II, it will be mandatory for the candidates to qualify all the sections
